

HURRICANE SAFETY TIPS



**Atlantic Hurricane Season:
June 1 - November 30**

1. Create a Family Evacuation Plan

Before an emergency happens, decide how you will get in contact with family, friends, and/or roommates, where you will go, and what you will do in an emergency. Keep a copy of this plan in your Emergency Supplies Kit or another safe place where it can be accessed in the event of a disaster.



2. Know Your Evacuation Zone

Find out if you live in a hurricane evacuation area and determine which area(s) should be evacuated in the case of an emergency.

3. Prepare Your Home & Check Insurance

Ensure your home is storm-ready by securing anything that could be damaged or cause damage. Review insurance policies and check for flooding and/or natural disaster coverage options.

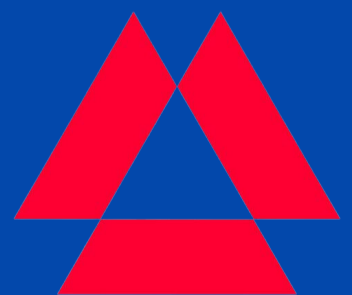


4. Make an Emergency Kit

Put together an Emergency Kit that is easily accessible in case of emergency and can be taken with you during a power outage, flooding, or road damage.

5. Register for Emergency Alerts

Register yourself for voice, text, and/or email alerts from City of Southport, Brunswick County, and NWS Wilmington to stay up-to-date.
